Though entirely unknown at the time, of these twenty-eight, during the next few years only ten were ever to endure through graduation. This year began the first of the many great adventures that were to follow and though we didn't do anything of really historic importance at the time, it was of great significance to each one of those of us who had our beginnings there. We had just begun when we had our first loss. It was Bonnie Ankeny; then Kent Richey dropped shortly after. Then after nine months of toil we were on our way to the first grade. Our new teacher was Miss Virginia Pfander. Along with our new teacher, we also picked up several new additions who were: Shirley Stevenson, Alma Cahoon, Etta Walker, and Roger Stevenson. We also lost four: Roger Stevenson, Etta Walker, Mary Emmons, and Leona Johnson.

After a few months of dodging homework, paper wads, and tests, we were more than ready for the second grade. Here again we gained some new friends: Mary Hossman, Janet Sanders, Patricia Kirby, Bonnie McFarland, Phillip Wagaman, Peter Beery, and Kent Richey, who after having looked for something better in California was now ready to accept dear old V. L. G. S. as being best and try again. Our teacher was Mrs. Ruth Ruckman. This year we decided that we would all surprise our mothers on Mother's Day by stenciling on table cloths with crayon and, indeed, we did for our efforts were truly unique and quite unconventional.

A few of our members, namely: Elmer Burns, Phillip Wagaman, Dean Archer, Joel Freeman, Sharon Fisher, Alma Cahoon, and Lois Lowenburg, were marooned in the second grade and had to wait for the next class going through. But the rest of us proceeded on to the third grade to meet our new teacher, Miss Miller. We gained five new additions who were: Sam Carmichael, David Rambo, Patricia Chambers, Mary Ellen Peterson, Betty Currin, and Leona Johnson, whom we had known before.

Alma Cahoon was one of the people we lost that year and Mary Ellen Peterson was the other. Our main objectives were learning to read better and learning to write with ink. Miss Miller also read to us several books that year, which we enjoyed more than our school work.

From here we went on to the fourth grade, a great advancement because we were now upstairs with the fifth and sixth grades. We were really getting to be big stuff. Our teacher this year was Mrs. Ruth Hentsch. Our new classmates were: Norma Miller, Marcia Bloom, Judy Williams, and Bill Dumbler. Our fourth grade year went smoothly according to calculations or should we say multiplication tables? Our losses this year were: Bill Dumbler, Patricia Chambers, Judy Williams, Duane Pullen, Joyce Selby, Norma Miller, and Donna Finkle.

Next came fifth grade and while we were on our way, we stopped to pick up an old friend, Bonnie Ankeny. The new teacher directing our class this year was Miss Mary Waymire, now Mrs. Ralph Strange. We gained a few classmates this year which helped to make up for the heavy loss last year. The new students were Leona Raines, Howard Watson, Bob Link, Sharon Cahoon, and Vernon Else.

Our fifth grade year proved to be an interesting year indeed. In search for new experiences of obvious educational value, we decided to have a party whenever we could. We began with a surprise birthday party for Miss Waymire. This we followed with several birthday parties for class members; then topped it all off with a big surprise engagement party for our teacher. Then we found out she was getting married to "Doc" Strange. Wow! We did have fun that year! In fact, we all enjoyed it so much that we decided that parties should become a class tradition from then on. Our only losses this year were: Howard Watson, Juanita O'Riley and Sharon Cahoon.
