Delegates and electors attended the annual spring meeting of Y-teens and YWCA. It was held in Des Moines in April and next year's program was voted upon.


The two main donations made by the club this year to the school were a complete uniform for the band, inside which a label with the club's name was attached, and a mirror for the Student Lounge.
