Larry Fast was on the mile relay team that placed fifth and on the 440 yard relay team that placed second. Richard Bangston was on the mile relay team that won fifth place.


This is the second consecutive year that the VCHS track team has won a state championship. In 1965, the team won the State Indoor Meet.
