The 440 yard relay team broke the Class B record in the preliminaries, but had their newly established record beaten in the finals.

All in all, it was a great season for the Bluejay track team. The team and their coach deserve the respect and admiration of their school and their community.

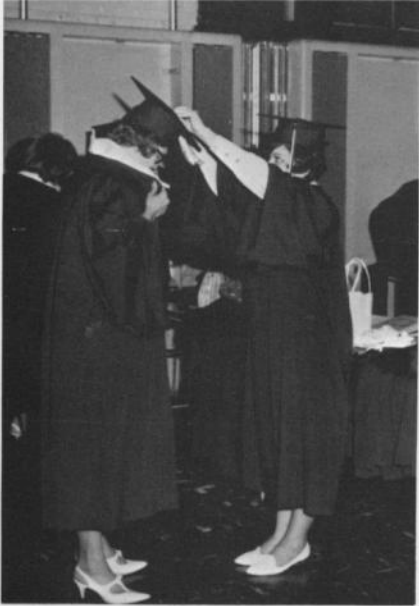
