Although vaulting is his first love, Phil has excelled in football, basketball, baseball, and also the running events of track. Named one of the most versatile athletes in SW Iowa, he has been the key to the most successful athletic year in Villisca history.

In the vault, he soared to the record height of 14'2 3/4", but lost this interscholastic mark to a student of Des Moines Roosevelt last spring. However, he still holds the following records: Bluejay, Tall Corn Conference, Cardinal relays, Mustang Relays, Tri-State Tarkio Relays, Drake Relays, Federation Meet, State Indoor Class B, and State Outdoor

Class B. He also placed seventh in the National Jaycee Meet at Denver, Colorado.

In addition to winning the vault at the Class B State Outdoor Meet, Phil anchored three gold medal winning relay teams.

During the football season, Phil, earning recognition as an "All Southwest Iowa Class B" quarterback, scored 12 touchdowns and 18 extra points and a field goal. He also passed for seven scores.

We hope that the 1967 Bluejay will help you remember this year always. We tried to make "This is the Year" the theme of the annual. We hope that "this was the year" for you, too.

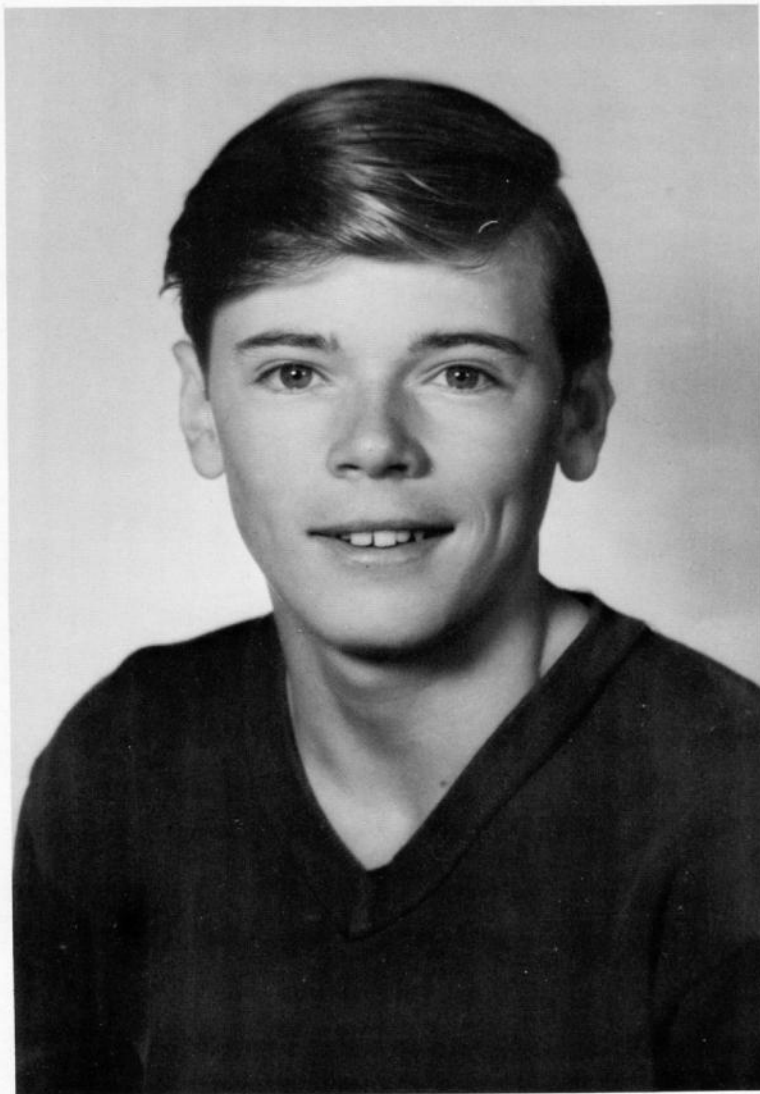
