





"We're the Champs"! was the cry of the 1971 Cross Country team as they captured the State Mile Team Race championship.

Yes, this was the year of many firsts for the Cross Country team. It was the team's first state championship and their first Invitational Cross Country Meet. The Villisca Harriers were first at the State Mile Team Race at Grinnell, the Villisca Invitational, the Adel Invitational, and finished in a tie for first at Urbandale. The team finished second at Red Oak's Invitational, the Clarinda Invitational, and the State Cross Country Run. They were third in their first meet of the season at the Abraham Lincoln Invitational. In dual competition, the Jays had 2 wins, 2 losses, and 1 tie while competing among the best competition in southwest Iowa.

Corning, another Tall Corn Conference team, won their class in the State Mile Team Race, which illustrated the strength of the Tall Corn Conference.

Mark Skahill won the State Cross Country Run for the second year which marks the fifth year in a row that Villisca has had the individual champion. The absence of seniors Mark Skahill, Mike Northup, and Rick Shearer will be felt next year; but underclassmen Doug Gray, John Kernen, David Skahill, and Mike Chaney will be returning to form a good nucleus for next year's team.




Magazine Sales

















The 1971-72 Jayettes

First of all I want to thank you for making it possible to come to Villisca.



From that moment and during several days all was confusion for me. Thank goodness now I think I understand English better.


When I return to Mexico I am planning to work as a bilingual secretary and at night take English classes. The classes that I took during my stay here I consider to be of great importance for my future life.
