


The Villisca Bluejay Basketball season was one of improvement by posting a 11-9 record, the best in several years. The Jays finished 5-7 in the Tall Corn Conference to tie for fourth in the final standings. Five of the Jays losses were to Corning, a top ranked team, and Mt. Ayr, who advanced to the Boys State Tournament. Three of the four remaining losses were by a total of 12 points. The Bluejays lost only two seniors, Jerry Baker and Tom Schafer and with six letterman returning should have a fine season next year. Jerry Baker led the Jays in both scoring and rebounding with a 13.5 and a 9.7 average respectively. Sophomore Terry Westerlund followed closely with a 12.2 and 8. 1 average. Brian Williams and Mike Schafer followed in scoring with 11.5 and 11.0 average. Jerry Baker was named to second team all conference and Terry Westerlund, Brian Williams, Mike Schafer, and Tom Schafer were named honorable mention.


