


All in all it was a week well spent and due to the co-operation of the students, faculty, and community, Homecoming '75 was a great success.

Other highlights were being asked to play at the Stanton Homecoming Parade and also playing for the opening of the Villisca Aluminum Foundry.


Kathy Kerr was elected band queen this year and she represented the band very well at various events. Another girl that did a fine job was Jeanna Hampel, our drum majorette.






Social Studies Department



Vocational Department consists of Larry Hummel, Sandra Munger, and Chris Nelson.






