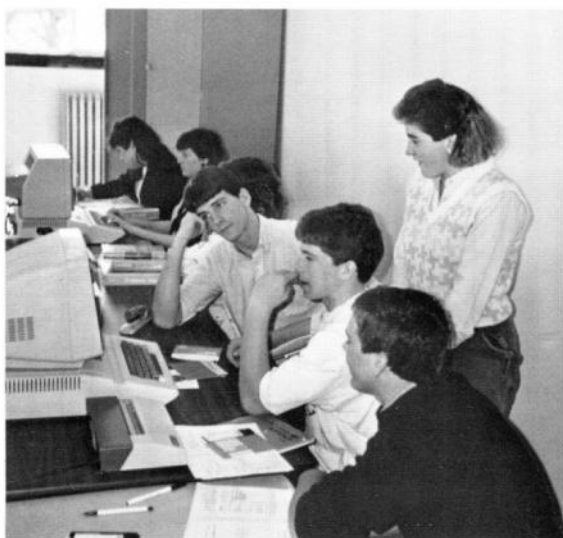
CHEERLEADERS

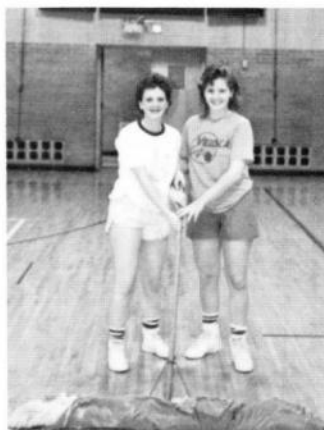

The Jayettes beat Lenox 43-40, and they slithered by Corning 59-58. The Jayettes worked very hard all season and they were very pleased with their new coaches.

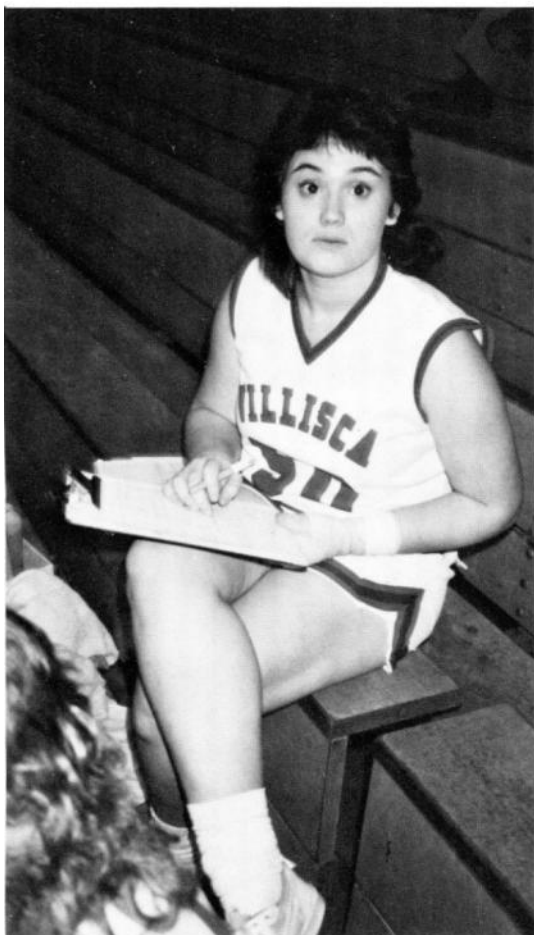
