





The Villisca Bluejay football team had a banner year in 1989. The team which was a fairly inexperienced one came off the gridiron this season rich with experience. Not since 1982 has a Villisca football team gone to the coveted State Playoffs.

The season started with the game against Stanton being postponed because of torrential rain. The game was played the next Monday with the Bluejays pulling off the victory (13-6).

After a short week of practice the Jays took a long trip to Coon Rapids and manhandled the host team (42-0).

The next Friday, the Bluejays survived the wind and the visiting Sidney Cowboys to win by a score of 20-12.

The Jays then had to rebound and get a victory over South Page to advance to the State Playoffs. They did win (26-7) and also earned the chance to play the Hamburg Wildcats in the first round of the 1989 tournament.


The game was played at Hamburg the following Thursday night.
