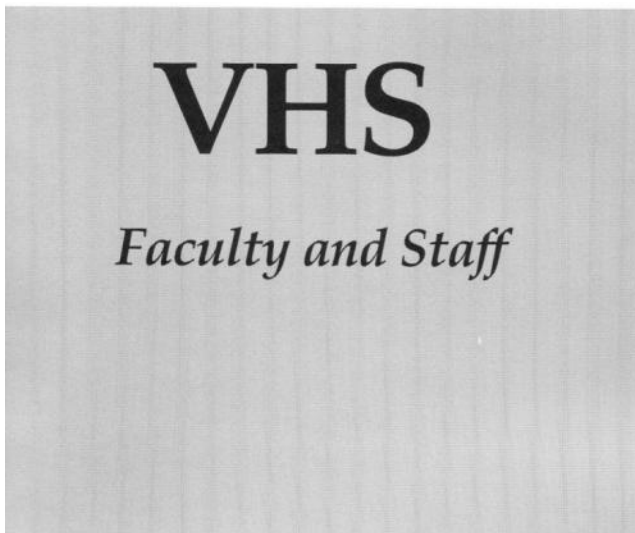
Mr. Matthew DeVore can be summed up in one word-----

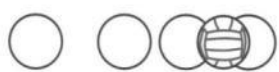

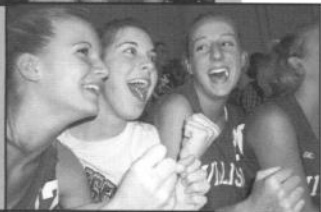

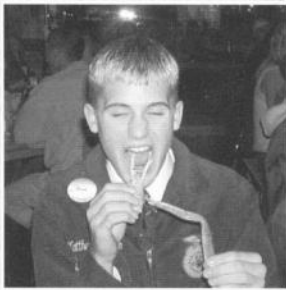

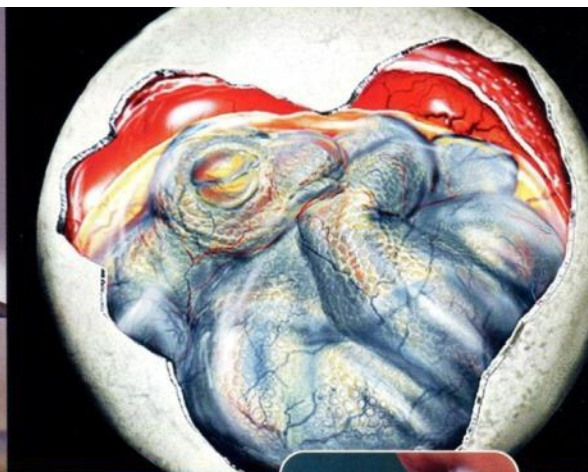

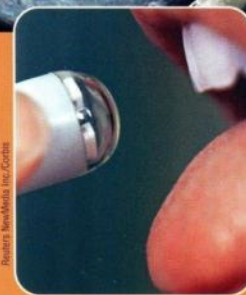

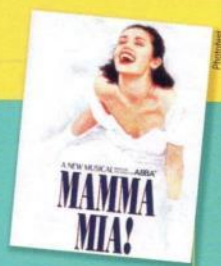

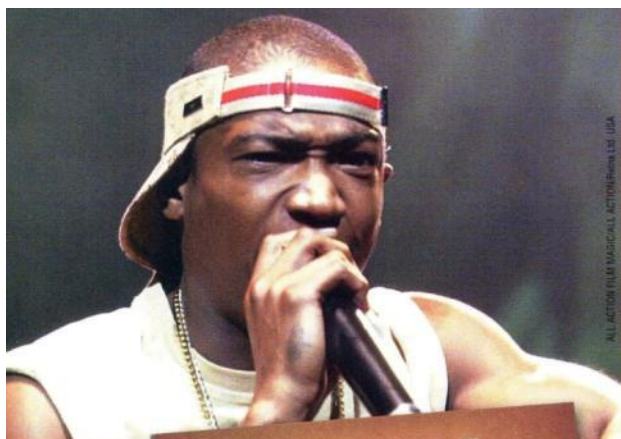

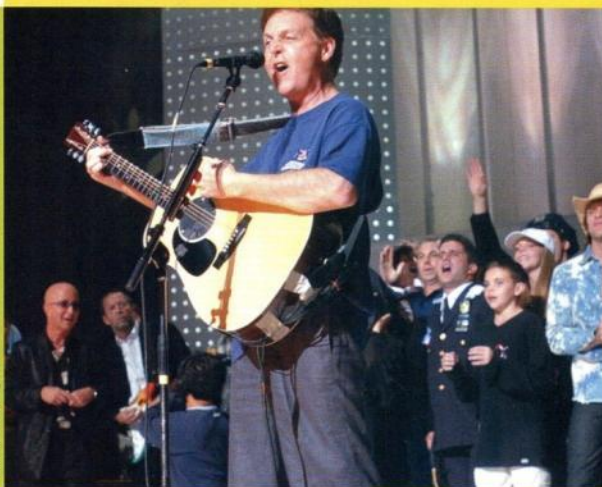

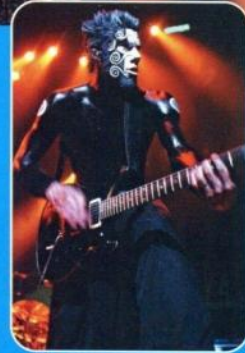

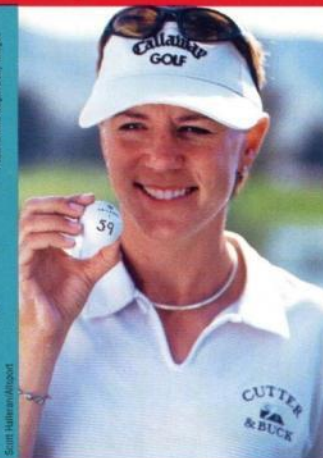

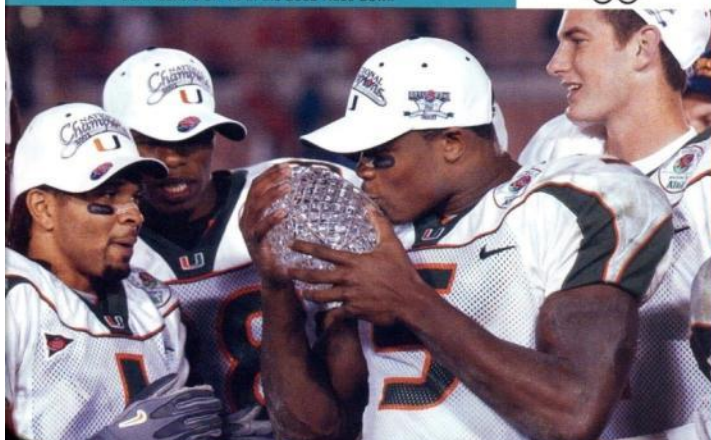

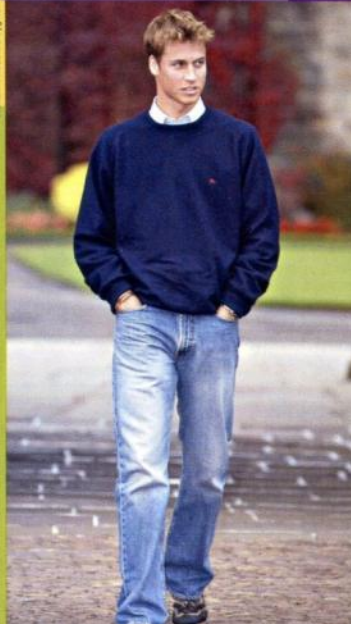
