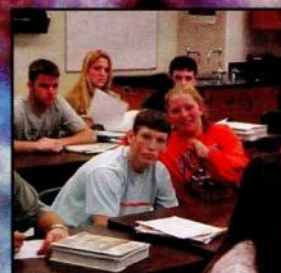

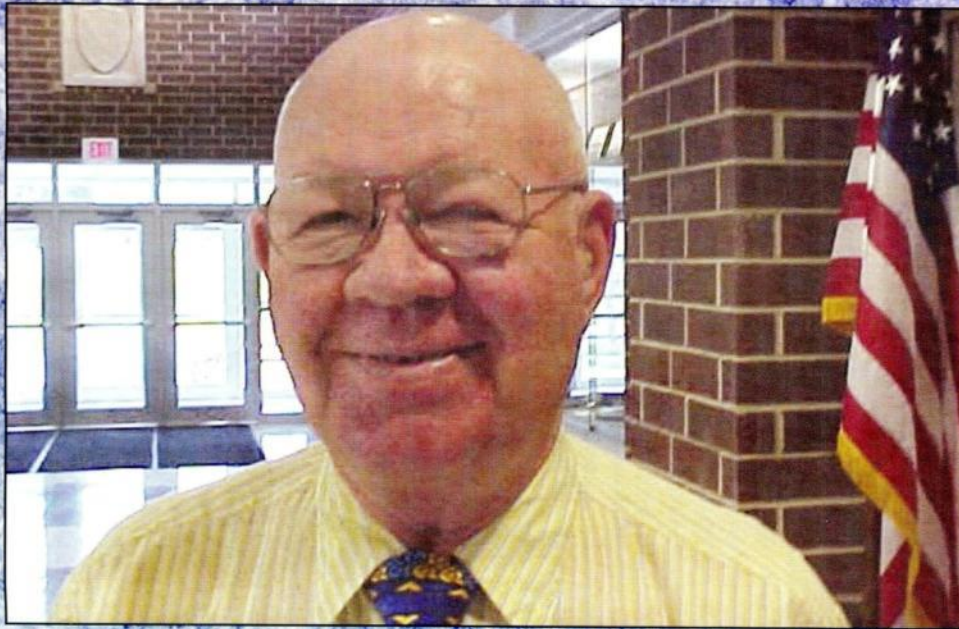

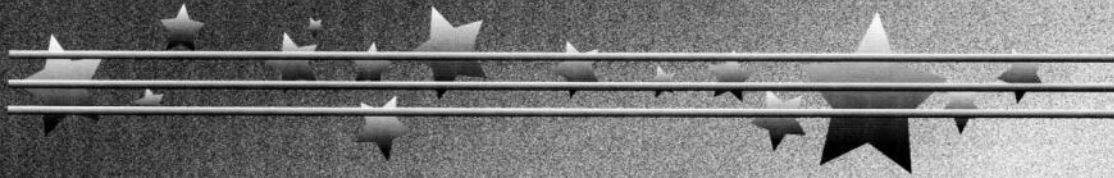
Dedication

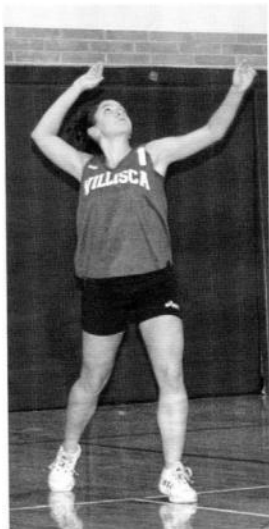

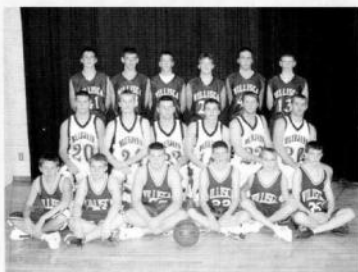

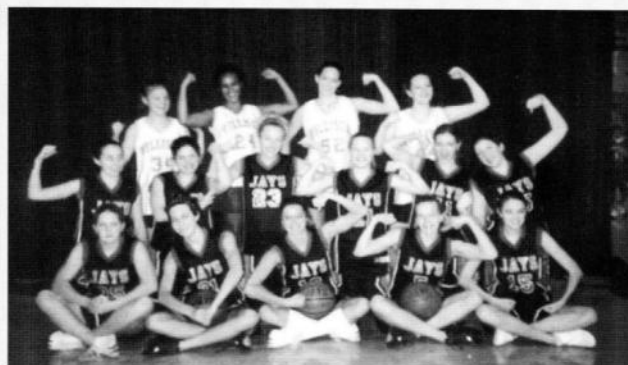

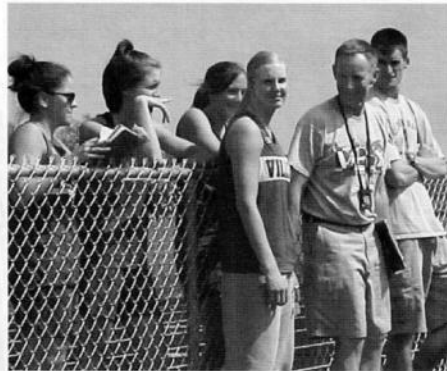

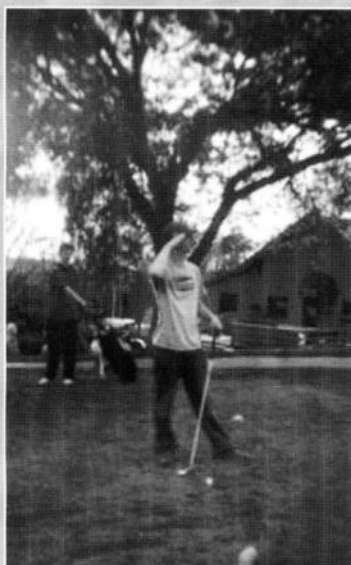

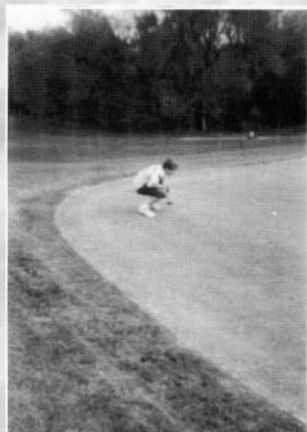

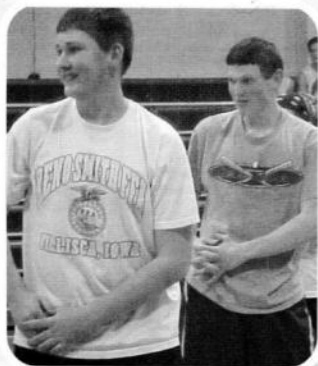

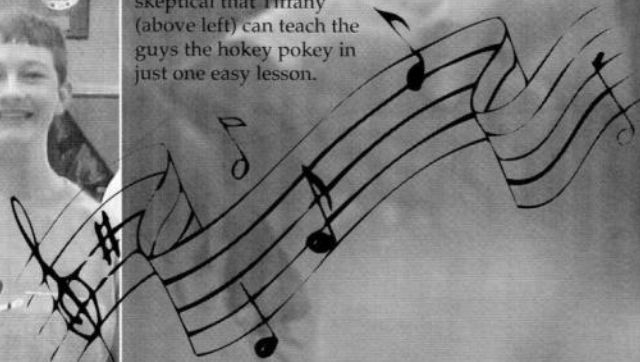

THE BLUEJAY BAND

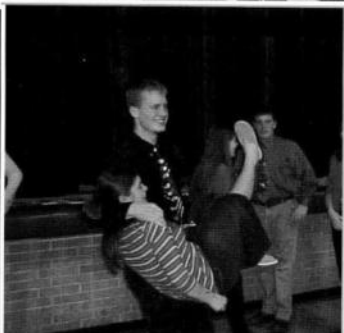

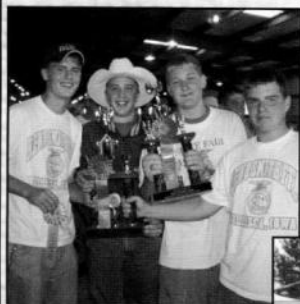

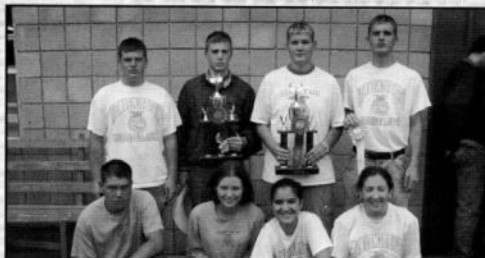

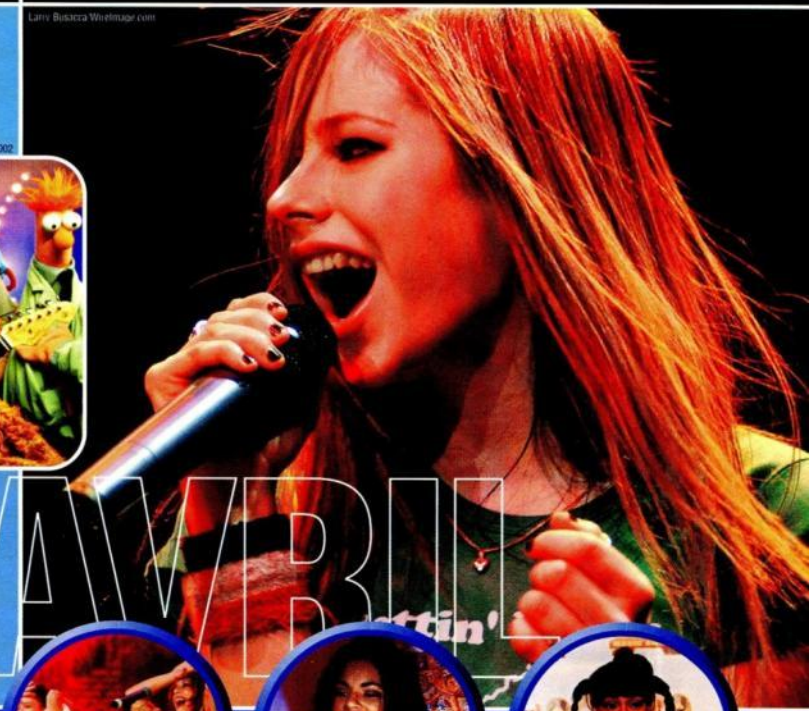

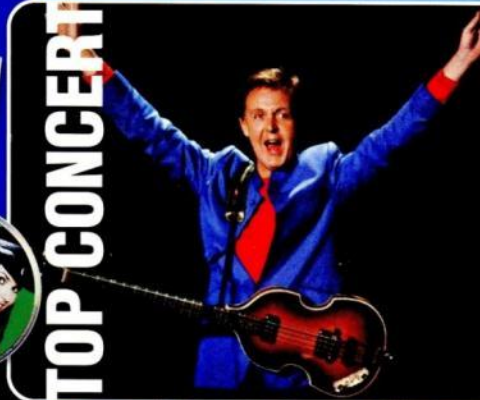

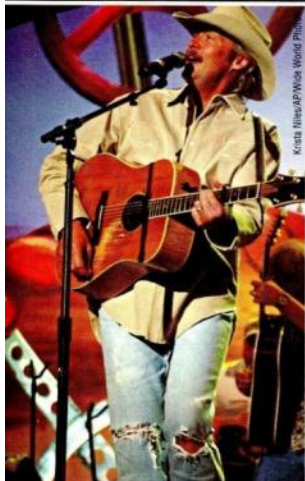

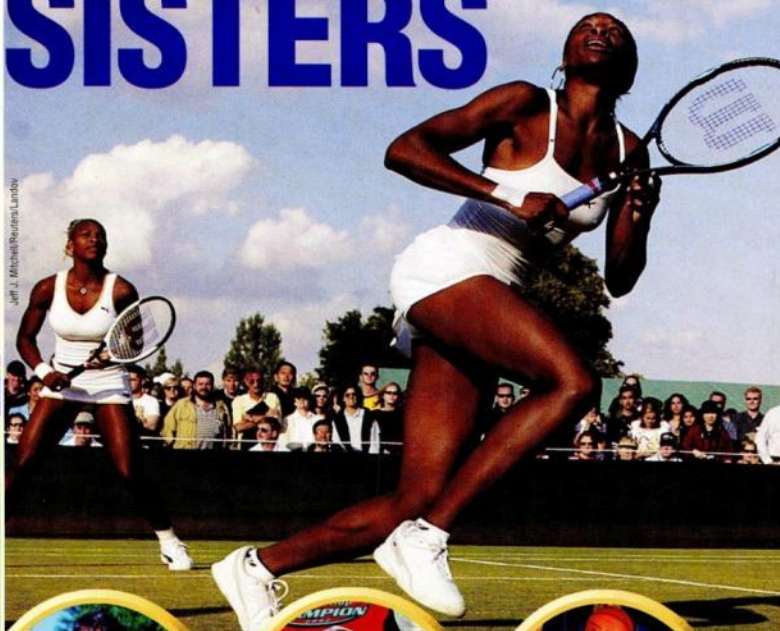

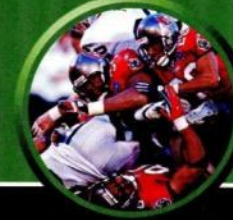

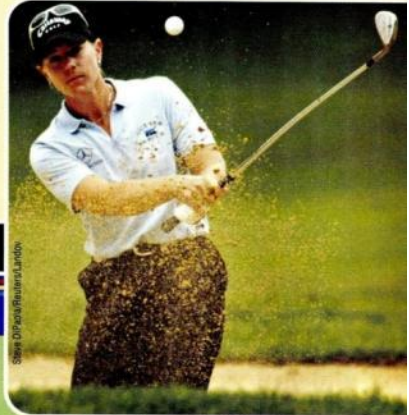
