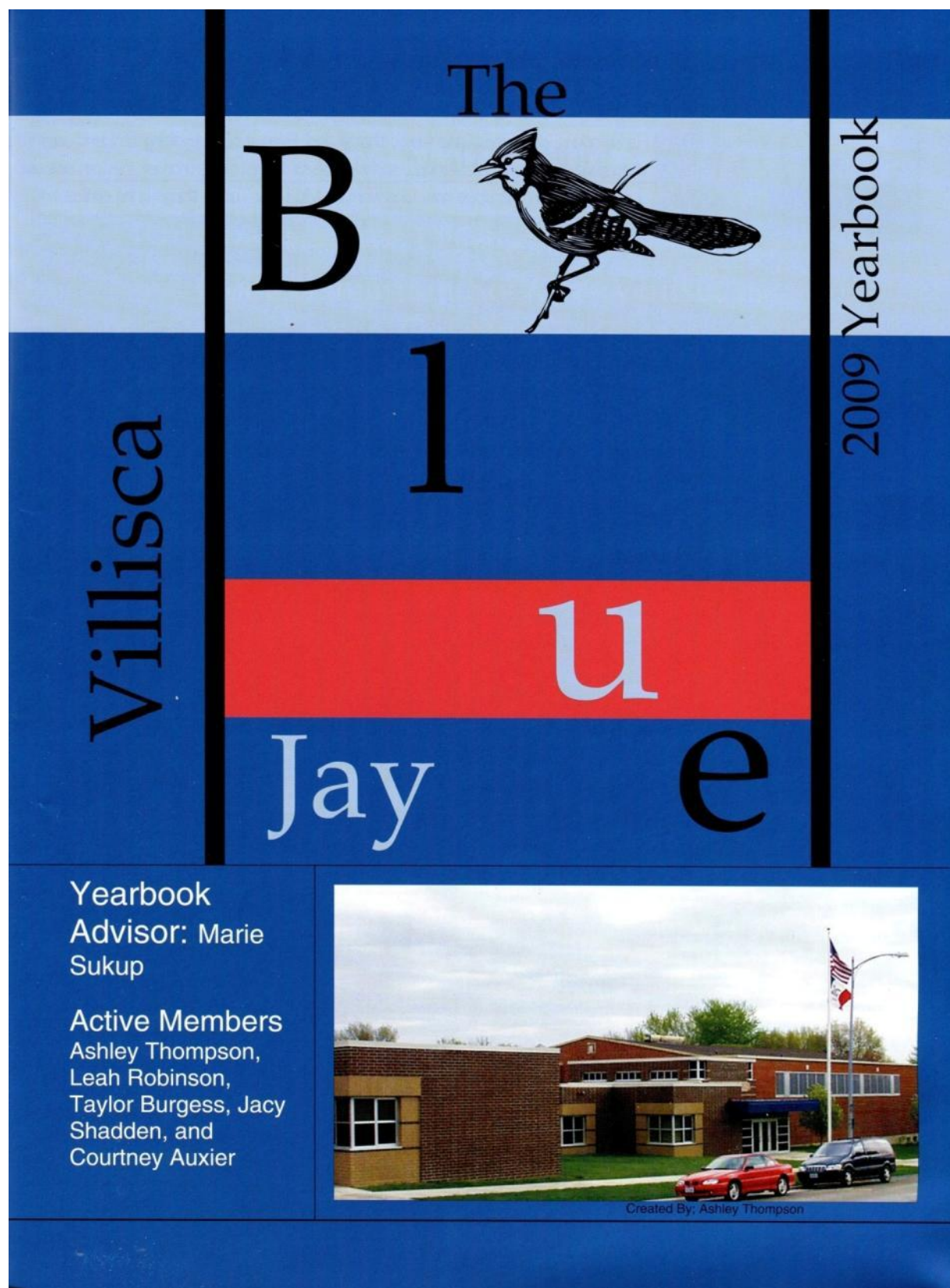
















## Dedication...

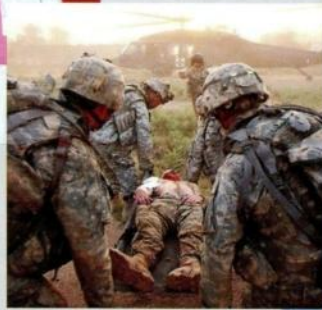
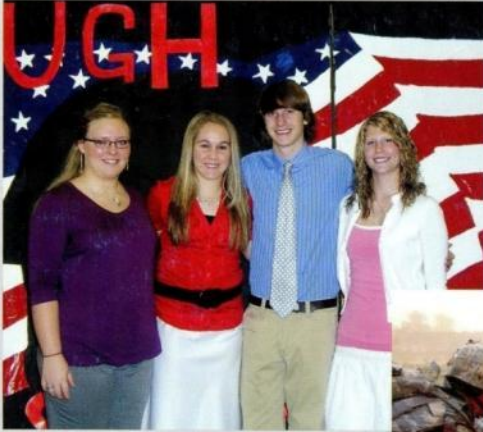






# 2008 Veteran's Day

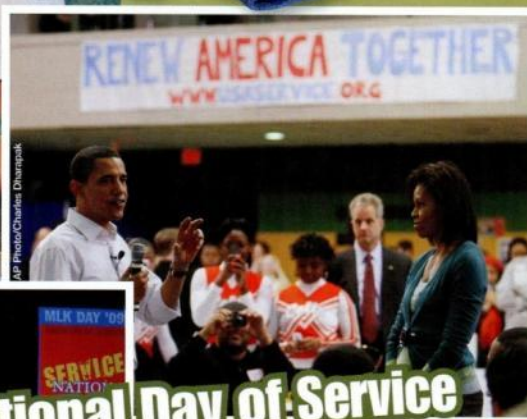
