The first school in Nodaway located on the present school property east of where the school stands today.


1879 - 1908

The 4th school building at a cost of \$80,000.00 second to none in any district of our size.

A HISTORY OF NODAWAY SCHOOLS From The Cardinal dated May 24, 1935, Volume II Number 15

The first school in Nodaway opened in the year 1869. A building was erected that year on the present school property near or on the site of the present custodian home. Ten years later the building became inadequate and was sold to the Presbyterian Church for a house of worship. The structure was moved from the site to the South near the present Mrs. Dora Devers home. When it became too small for this purpose it was moved to the business district where it housed a number of business concerns including the village printing office and the office of the towns first garage. It was finally torn down in the fall of 1934.

The record of the school elections gives March 19, 1873 as the first held in this independent district. At this election, Marshall Bullock, A.G. Kennon, and Mr. Merrick were elected directors. With the school having been permanently organized, new and increased interest was taken in it. As immigration moved westward and interest in scholarship increased, a new and larger school house was built in 1879. This was a two story frame building and was built at the site of the old building.

Professor Worley was the first principal having sixty-five or seventy pupils and one assistant. The same three rooms were fitted up and with steadily increasing attendance the school made rapid progress. During all this time the home interest in the school was increasing and scholars outside were anxiously seeking admission into what was considered the second best school in the County.

About 1885 opposing factions from outside the district succeeded in dividing our territory which contained thirteen sections of land. We were reduced from thirteen to two sections with a scholarship of from sixty-five to seventy. Having now lost our independence, the township board was charitable enough to allow Nodaway one teacher at \$35.00 per month. Accepting the situation however the best instructors possible at the salary were employed. A few of those were Professor Howard of Nebraska, Mrs. Emma Carlisle, A.J. Linn, Howard Russell, Miss Mary Sawyer, Mr. Blick, A.C. Peckham, D.H. Myerhoff and others. In 1891 there were eighty-five pupils in school with one teacher, Mrs. Oscar Starr.

With this increased enrollment the people were naturally inclined to return to independence again. This, after a bitter contest, was affected in 1900, with our district boundary remaining unchanged. A progress continued, the people became dissatisfied with a two-year high school. So in 1905 a four-year high school was organized and was high school department was handled by one teacher, Professor C.V. Frazier.

In 1908 a brick building was erected just South of the present building at the cost of \$4,000. This building was much better fitted to take care of the twelve grades than the former. In 1909 Nodaway graduated its first Senior Class of only two members, Miss Bessie Norcutt (McCoy) and Mr. Wilbert Shipley.

The year 1915 is an outstanding year in the history of our high school as the first two extra-curricular activities were added, boys basketball and declamatory. The growing interest in public speaking and debating suggested to the faculty that there might be talent for orations or dramatic art lying dormant in some of our home boys and girls. So the plans for a mid-winter contest were laid and soon ten eager contestants were in the race for honors. Mrs. Ida C. Robb of Creston was employed to train the contestants. As the students were entirely inexperienced, she found several "backwoods preachers" and others whom many would consider almost hopeless. With a week of careful training, however, Mrs. Robb was able to produce a decided change in the character of the work. Harry Moore won first over all and Gwendoline Gibson was second. The first prize was a \$5.00 gold piece and second was \$2.50.

The first boys basketball team to represent N.H.S. was in 1915. This inexperienced team made a wonderful showing under the conditions. The members of the team were: Myron Taylor, Ned Eastlack, Clyde Willett, Franz Copoland, Fred Wilson and William Gibson.

In 1916 the first girls' team made its appearance with only one of the team ever before participating in the game. The team was developed into one which was able to cope with schools of far its superiority in numbers. The members of the team were: Genevieve Eastlack, Avanelle Gidley, Geraldine Shane, Inez Moser, Vivian Carothers, Ida Devers and Marianne Wilson.

When consolidated school districts became popular, one was agitated for Nodaway. In 1919 five rural districts voted to consolidate with the Nodaway school and the wealth, students and interest of 24 sections were centered in one school. The school opened in the fall of 1919 with Mr. E.E. Kuhn as superintendent and a supporting staff of six teachers. The school building was entirely inadequate to house the increased enrollment and the Vaughn hotel building was purchased for the elementary department.

On June 14, 1921, the consolidated district voted bonds for the erection of a new \$80,000 school building. Work was begun on it almost immediately and in the fall of 1922 school was opened in the building second to none in any district of our size that we know about.

In 1930 increased enrollment was a deciding factor in another change in the school. The eight elementary grades were rather crowded in the second floor rooms and the high school had plenty of room. The eight grade was moved to the third floor and became a part of the high school organization. The following year the seventh grade was also moved to this organization and the school completely organized on a 6-6 plan.

Other recent changes include a complete program of landscaping. In October 1933 the South half of the school yard was reduced to a level playground and athletic field by interested and willing friends and patrons of the school. Over 2,000 yards of dirt were moved, about eighty men worked on the job at different times, as many as 45 head of horses were at work at one time, and within seven days the work was finished entirely without monetary cost to the district. Since then other less important changes have been made in the landscape by moving dirt, trees and shrubs have been put out to add to the appearance of the grounds. Later swings, teeter totters and a large slide were added.

YELLOW SCHOOL BUS

I started to school in the fall of 1937. When school started we were riding in one of the old green busses. Sometime that fall we got a new bus and it was "Yellow". Very small I think one side had four seats, the other five seats. Victor Else was our driver.

Sometime about fourth or fifty grade we got "Hot Lunch". One of the first schools to have it. By that time Joe McCoy was our bus driver. He milked several cows, so he would bring cans of milk on the bus to school every day for lunch. Imagine this happening today. We always had plenty of milk and orange juice. Sloppy Joes and Chili is the food I remember best.

Each grade school room had two grades with one teacher. When we got to eighth grade we got to go up with the High School kids. We thought that was great – but they said "Just another bunch of little kids".

Class plays, basketball games, Junior-Senior Banquet, Senior Skip Day, Junior and Senior color fight night of Senior Skip Day was always interesting.

Graduating in the spring of 1950 I was the only one in the class all thirteen years. Also rode all those years in the same "Yellow" school bus.







70TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE 1916 GRADUATION CLASS OF NODAWAY.

Our class of twelve started to Nodaway High School in September 1912 as Freshmen under the supervision of Professor Fraser. When we graduated in 1916, the number had dwindled to eight graduates. Of the class, all but Harry Moore & Jessie Narigon have taught school at one time or another.

After graduation, William (Bill) Gibson attended Parson College for one year. When he received an appointment to West Point Army Academy. He attended West Point one year, then decided to return to Parson and complete his education there. He worked his way thru college.

In 1923 he married another teacher, Helen Lewis of Corning. They had two daughters. He taught in various schools, but in 1928 he became principal of Waterloo, Iowa West Hi where re remained for 40 years before retiring in 1968. He had the reputation of being a very fair minded and understanding person. Later in life he developed leukemia and died in 1983. He is buried in Corning, Iowa. Mrs. Gibson still lives in their home.

Avanelle Gidley taught school for four years after graduation. She married Harv Garner. They had two sons and four daughters. Eventually they settled at Fr. Madison, Iowa where Harv was a guard at the penitentiary and Avanelle worked in a ammunition plant at nearby Burlington. Avanelle died in 1994. Both she and her husband are buried at Ft. Madison.

Ida Devers graduated from Iowa State Teachers College with an Elementary Education degree. Her two most interesting schools, seven years at Nodaway, Iowa , 3rd & 4th grades where she had attended and 18 years at Council Bluffs, she taught 3rd grade in the Washington School until she retired. When her health failed in 1982, she entered the Good Samaritan Center in Villisca where she receives excellent care.

Inex Moseer taught for four years after graduation then she married William Cochran. They had a son and daughter. William farmed until his heart failed. They moved to Bellevue, Nebr. 

We didn't have too many exciting things happen to us in our third grade except the time when we played hookey by not coming in from recess and had to stay in too, to make up for it.

In September 1938, we were in the fourth grade and were permitted have recess with the "big kids". Miss Ava Smith was our teacher. We lost Kathryn Fidler and Clara Margaret Jackson, but we also had a new class-mate, Elsie Selby.

Miss Smith was our teacher for the fifth grade, too, but we had a fewnew class-mates. Those who were in the fifth grade, 1939-1940, were: Elsie Selby, Harlan Pond, Rowena Palmer, Dale Cozad, Donald Scanlan, Richard Williams, Kenneth Shipley, Beverly Windom, Dale Bowman, Glen Walter, Mary Ann Hendrickson, and Billy Thomas. We spent all of our noons and recesses building grass huts and staging wars, during our fourth and fifth grades. Miss Smith made us tear down our huts when Glen Walter got a stick poked in his eye as he was making a quick get-a-way from the enemy.

By 1940 when we were in the sixth grade we thought we were really grown up. Our teacher during the sixth and seventh grades was Miss Helen Grundman. The students who finished the seventh grade and were ready for the eighth were: Thelma Cozad, Harlan Pond, Rowena Palmer. Dale Bowman, Glen Walter, Mary Ann Hendrickson, Donald Scanlan, Kenneth Shipley, Beverly Windom, and Vernon Brees.

On August 28, 1942, we all came upstairs together to begin what you would really call school. Of course we were a little awe-struck at first, but we got used to the change and really began to fit into the high-school

activities by the time the school year was over. Our teachers were: Supt. Howard J. Spicknall, Coach Lester Watt, Mrs. R. W. Curry, and Miss Ruth Fairley.

On the 14th of September the following so called "green freshmen", were initiated into high-school: Beulah Haley, Bob Walter, Ed Greenfield, Viles Johnston, Mary Ann Hendrickson, Rowena Palmer, Beverly Windom, Thelma Cozad, Donald Scanlan, Vernon Brees, Harlan Pond, Glen Walter, and Kenneth Shipley. Our upper-classmen set up a stiff set of rules and things for us to do, if we didn't we were really going to get it that night. It wasn't so bad even if we girls had to wear our dad's clothes and the boys had to wear girls dresses and make-up. Our teachers during our freshman year were: Supt. Howard Spicknall, Mrs. Howard Watts, Mrs. Glen Fox, and Coach Lester Watt.

By the time we were sophomores we thought we really knew all there was to know about high school life. Rowena Palmer broke her leg on Oct. 31, and had to quit for the rest of the year. Darwin Miller was a new student in the spring. Supt. H. J. Spicknall, Coach Lester Watt, Mrs. Howard Watts, and Miss Annabelle Stone were our teachers that year.

On September 10, 1945, we started our next to the last year of school. We had a new Supt. that year, J. E. McCoy. The other faculty members were: Coach Lester Watt, Mrs. Edwin Stevenson, and Miss Dorothy Hanlon, Mr. McCoy left the beginning of the second semester, and W. G. Bennett, was our new Supt. We lost Ed Greenfield, Darwin Miller, Harlan Pond, and gained Keith Stenger in the spring. The class officers were: Pres. --Mary Ann Hendrickson, V. Pres. -- Beverly Windom, and Sec. & Treas. -- Beulah Haley. We gave our Junior Class Play, "Pleased ta Meetcha", on December 20, We had our Junior-Senior banquet on May 3. We were told it was one of the most elaborate banquets ever given in Nodaway High School.

We started our last year of school on September 1, 1946. Of the 13

pupils who started their school life together, only two remain, Mary Ann Hendrickson and Kenneth Shipley. Others who have joined us along the way and will graduate with us are: Thelma Cozad, Bob Walter, Glen Walter, Donald Scanlan, Vernon Brees, Viles Johnston, and Keith Stenger. Our teachers this year are: Supt. W. G. Bennett, Coach Harry Ewing, Lester Watt, Mrs. Otis Westphal, and Rev. Carl Stiefel. Mrs. Elizabeth Bennett and Miss Irene Hood taught the first semester. Class officers are: Pres.--Viles Johnston, V. Pres.--Vernon Brees, and Sec. & Treas.--Keith Stenger. Lester Watt has been one of our teachers from the 8th grade, through our high school years.

Thus brings us up to 1947. The members of our class are Wilma Everett, Leora Pond, Rosa March, Dean Windom, Donald Williams, Billy Berry, Johnny Bowers, Bonnie Stowell, Ardis Williams, Kieth Jett, Wayne Lewis, Wayne Carmichael, Roma Guss, Joane Rhamy, and Abbie Stenger. Wilma Everett, Leora Pond, and Dean Windom were the only ones that went all nine years in this school.

HISTORY OF SEVENTH GRADE CLASS

In the year 1939 there were twelve pupils beginning their school life. They were: Mary Scanlan, Joyce Lynam, Bobby Haley, Twyla Lacox, Duane Williams, Jeannie Emmans, Martha Page, Waverly Brown, Mary Jo Walters, Marjorie Richie, Forest Patton, Edward Hayes, Lily Selby. Our teacher was Miss McKee.

We kept all of our classmates in the Primary Grade, but the next year we lost Waverly Brown, Martha Page, Jeannie Emmans. Our teacher was still Miss McKee. Our music teacher, Mr. Nixon.

The next year was a happy one because we got to move into a new room. Our teacher was Miss Cortes. In the second grade we lost Edward Hayes, Bobby Haley, Forest Patton. We gained Floyd Haley, Marvin Cozad, Waverly Brown, and Barbara Durbin. The next year was our third grade, our teacher was Miss Stafford. We then gained Clyde Williams. We have received some new books this year but are especially proud of the new Book of Knowledge.

CLASS HISTORY

On September 4, 1937, thirteen little boys and girls started their school life. They were: Barbara Pond, Deloris Hendrickson, Jean Steadman, Leonard Raymo, Harold De LaMater, Francis Stewart, James Seidler, Colene Shepherd, Deloris Murphy, Luella Patton, Wanda Rhamy, Ardith Fitch, and Donald Nichols. Our teacher was Miss Gruenau. We remember those days very well. We wouldn't have minded having a few more half-pints of fresh milk or coco when we got hungry waiting for the noon hour to roll around this year.

By the time we were ready for the second grade we still had thirteen pupils, however they were not all the original beginners. Francis Stewart, Bonnie Thomas, Bobby Watts, Jean Stalders, Earl Calhoon, and Robert Calhoon were new students, Miss Ruth Thompson (Mrs. Wayne Spencer) was our teacher.

Miss Thompson was our teacher for the third grade also. We lost Jean Stalder, Francis Stewart, and Bonnie Thomas from our class, but we also gained two new classmates, Billy Perkins and Mike Haley. This is the year we worked so hard for perfect spelling lessons to attain small awards.

In September, 1940, we were in the fourth grade, and thought we were quite a bit older in moving to a new room. Our teacher was Miss Ava Smith. We had three new pupils, Joe Baldwin, Wilma Chubick, and Rita Meggison.

We entered the fifth grade with four new pupils; Dean Hunter, Maxine Brees, Eugene Northup, and Junior Cozad. This made our enrollment total fifteen. Miss Smith continued as our teacher in the fifth grade.

In the fall of 1942, we moved to the most advanced room on the grade floor, the seventh and eighth grade. Miss Helen Grundman was our teacher. The students were: Joe Baldwin, Maxine Brees, Wilma Chubick, Junior Cozad, Dean Hunter, Jean Steadman, Deloris Hendrickson, Barbara Pond, Elizabeth Scanlan, Colene Shepherd, James Seidler, Mike Haley, Warren Templeton, and Jim Stalder.

Our teacher for the seventh grade was Miss Thelma Stafford. We lost Colene Shepherd and Wilma Chubick this year and gained Ronald Guss.

By the time we were ready for the eighth grade we thought we were really grown up, for we moved upstairs with the high school. We began to fit into the high school activities by the end of the eighth grade year. Our teachers were Miss Annabelle Stone (Mrs. Elmer Simpson), and Lester Watt. Our Superintendent was H. J. Spicknall.

On the fifteenth day of September in 1945, we were initiated into high school. The "green freshies" were: Jim Stalder, Elizabeth Scanlan, Maxine Brees, Deloris Hendrickson, Barbara Pond, James Seidler, Jean Steadman, Mildred Sweeten, Mike Haley, Ed Freuck, and Franklin Walter.

Mildred joined us from New Market, and Ed and Franklin from Nodaway Number Eight. Our teachers were Miss Dorothy Hanlon, Mrs. Roberta Stevenson, Superintendent John McCoy, and Superintendent William G. Bennett.

Jim Stalder dropped out of our class the year we were Sophomores. Superintendent W. G. Bennett, Coach Harry Ewing, Rev. Carl Stiefel, Mrs. Elizabeth Bennett, Mrs. Otis Westphal, and Miss Irene Hood taught during this year. Class officers for this year were: President, Deloris Hendrickson; Vice-President, Ronald Guss; Secretary and Treasurer, Maxine Brees.

On September 3, 1946, we started our Junior year. We lost James Seidler and gained Louis Bradway from Coburg. Class officers were: President, Ronald Guss; Vice-President, Deloris Hendrickson; Secretary and Treasurer, Maxine Brees. Superintendent W. G. Bennett, Miss Irene Annan, Mrs. Evelyn Bebb, and Coach Floyd Welander, were our teachers. This year was very much enjoyed preparing for the Junior and Senior Banquet, and many more things. We received our class rings this year and all of us were very happy over them.

We started our last year of school on August 29, 1948, with all hopes to graduate together on May 11, 1949. Of the thirteen pupils who started their school life, only two remain to graduate together, they being Barbara Pond and Deloris Hendrickson. We lost two pupils during our Senior year: Jean Steadman and then Jean Lewis who moved to Corning where she will complete her school year. Our class officers are: President, Deloris Hendrickson; Vice-President, Mike Haley; Secretary and Treasurer, Ed Freuck. Superintendent John H. Wetzler, Miss Irene Aman, Coach Earl E. Lowe, and Mrs. Helen Gripp were our final years teachers.

SENIOR CLASS HISTORY

Long ago--in 1944 to be exact--a tribe of very small but very wild Indians banded together and set out upon the warpath Knowledge, for the purpose of conquering an ancient foe, Ignorance. Sometime later, sensing a general lack of interest, Big Chief Smid called a council which they named "Initiation Day." This celebration turned out to be a big war-party at which the Seniors entertained the younger Redskins much to their own embarrassment.

Then having made their work in the tribal sports and musical pow-wow, they rested from the battle for several moons.

When they collected again, later in Indian Summer, they again chose Chief Grimit and made a sudden raid on History but the whole Tribe defeated Cassar in the Gaulic Wars.

Connie Gravett came to Iowa clear from Spring Dale, Oregon, where she started school. She attended school there for only seven weeks. After coming to Iowa, she was enrolled at Douglas No. 7 near Carbon. She joined our class the last part of the first grade. Connie played basketball this year. She was also President of the Jr. High this year and a member of the Student Council.

Susan Jenkins started her school life at a little country school near Corning. During her second year of school she transferred to Nodaway. Susan has been a participant in the County Spelling Contest at Corning for the last three years.

Janis Carmichael attended a country school near Emerson until her family moved to the Nodaway community. She was then in the second grade. Janis played basketball this year and was a cheerleader this year and last. She was also a class officer this year.

At the age of five, Merrill Heard began school at Corning. At the beginning of the second grade he attended school at Brooks. While in the third grade he came to Nodaway where he has been since.

Mrs. Pearl Smith was our teacher when we were in the third grade.

Eddie Meredith joined us in the fourth grade when Mrs. Lola Jones was our teacher.

Bill Dumler started to school in a little country school north of Villisca. After attending several other rural schools he started to Nodaway during the fifth grade when Miss Betty Jean Shields was our teacher.

Norma Miller began her school career at Central Park School in Omaha. At the beginning of the third grade she moved to Villisca with her parents where she attended school at the Lincoln building until in the fifth grade when she came to Nodaway.

In 1950 Georgina Clausen entered our class. Before coming to Nodaway, Georgina attended schools near Harlan, Randolph, and Shenandoah.

Harold Hall's school life began at the age of five. He attended Hill Crest country school until he started to Villisca. The second semester of the seventh grade he came to Nodaway.

Shortly after Harold entered our class, Ronald Weil joined us. Ronald attended the following schools before coming to Nodaway: Elliott, Hill Crest, Frog Pond, and McMillan.

Because we were always interested in having our class grow, we welcomed four new students into the eighth grade. They were Bill King, Dorothy King, Lola Cihak, and Donna Hoffman.

Donna has attended Douglas No. 4 north of Nodaway for the last two years but because the school has been closed, she came to Nodaway this year.

Lola has attended Pierce No. 3 for the last four years and Bill and Dorothy have been attending McMillan school. Lola, Dorothy, and Bill came to Nodaway for the eighth grade to get acquainted with their classmates before starting to high school.


So as you see by our class history, our class has tripled since we started in 1944. Four more years will tell how many of us will be on this platform in 1957 for senior commencement.

This letter was sent to Mary Scanlan Welsch from Kathryn M. Sullivan Loidolt.

Yes, I did teach in Nodaway Consolidated School from September 1946 to May 1947. I had 28 pupils in the Fifth and Sixth Grade for all subjects. There were 11 teachers at that time. My salary was \$1575 for the nine month school year. The Seventh and Eighth Grade teacher, Mrs. Hyatt, from Corning, I believe was her name, Miss Fellows, Third and Fourth Grade teacher, and I lived in an apartment above the chicken and grain building on Main Street in Nodaway from Sunday evening til Friday afternoon.

William G. Bennett was the superintendent and Wilma O'Riley was the First and Second Grade teacher in 1946-47 school year. My contract was offered but I wanted to go to a bigger school. I went to Perry, Iowa, for 3 years, returned to ISTC CEDAR FALLS, IOWA. After I received my BA in Education I taught 3 months in Eagle Grove, Iowa; journeyed to Roseville, California for one year because I was too young to be accepted by the US Dept. of Defense to go overseas to teach in the Military Dependent Schools. In 1952 I went to Sendal American School in Sendal, Japan, 300 miles north of Tokyo for 2 years; in 1954 I transferred to Germany for 7 years; met my husband from Minnesota in Heldelberg, Germany; transferred to Asmara, E Africa for 1 year; transferred to Seoul, Korea for one year and to Sagamihara American School, outside of Tokyo for 3 years. Our son was born in the US Military Hospital. It was time to return to the US. after 14 years Overseas in 1966. We settled in Indianapolis, Indiana, where I also taught for 7 years. I stopped teaching and worked for Indiana Bell Phone Company where there was no discipline problems.

My year at Nodaway helped me to adjust to the many people I met in the future years around the World. Thank you for hiring me. I had had only 2 years of experience in teaching in a one room school in Adams County, Mercer # 8. It was 4 miles from my home and I rode a horse 8 miles a day. Teaching in Nodaway was much easier.

I do not have any memos because at 83 years old I've been cleaning things out before I cancel out of this world.


